The Disciples Peace Fellowship creates & awards this recognition to a member/members of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) whose efforts, like those of Todd, have been characterized by early actions for peace & justice. Todd was a compassionate young man, he was a dreamer but didn't wait until he was "grown up" to start living out his dreams. Todd died in an unfortunate skiing accident. Todd's family and DPF remember and honor his faithful witness at each General Assembly. The Award is recognized at the DPF Breakfast and the recognition is accompanied by a gift of \$500 to be used as the recipient chooses. 2015 Todd Bratkovich Awardee is Chrissy Stonebraker-Martinez of Cleveland, Ohio. The Award was presented by her former pastor, Rev. Allen V. Harris, the newly elected Regional Minister for the Christian Church Capital Area.

Will Witkamper Award:

During each General Assembly of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) the Disciples Peace Fellowship announces the honoree for the lifetime peacemaker achievement award which honors individuals who have dedicated themselves to advancing the causes of peace and justice. The honoree's names are inscribed on a permanent trophy main-



tained by Disciples Peace Fellowship at the Disciples Center in Indianapolis, Indiana. The honoree joins an illustrious list of previous winners of the award and an announcement of the honor is made at the General Assembly.

Background of Will Wittkamper:

The Award, given every two years since 1981, is named for Will Wittkamper, a Disciples pastor who was active in the struggle for racial equality in the mid-twentieth century in the United States. Rev. Wittkamper was a strong supporter of Clarence Jordan at the interracial community Koinonia Farms in Americus, Georgia. **2015 Will Wittkamper Awardee is Rev. Ken Kennon of Tucson, Arizona**
