As we prepare for another summer of working with DPF Peace Interns, the Disciples Peace Fellowship Executive Committee is stepping out in faith that we can meet the present and future hopes for working with these young leaders.

Each summer the Peace Interns do amazing work on behalf of the gospel imperative for peace and justice.

Last summer they discovered new and challenging ways to do that work during a pandemic — working remotely with online church camps while partnering with Disciples Ministry Groups on specific projects. As life shifts with the arrival of COVID-19 vaccines, this summer will be a hybrid of some camp experiences (in-person as well as online) along with partnering with other peace and justice ministries within the Disciples family and the ecumenical

The DPF Executive Committee thanks you for the ways you give financial, prayerful and emotional support to the peace interns. There are two ways we are seeking your ongoing support for this mission as well as the overall work of Disciples Peace Fellowship.

First, it has been several years since we increased the stipend that we provide our interns. This year we are increasing this amount by \$500 to each intern. This will add additional needs of \$1500 to the 2021 annual budget, and we seek your support for this stipend increase. DPF Executive Committee members have already agreed to increase their financial support this year, and we hope that you will join them!

Second, since this is a need for the future as well, I invite you to consider becoming a part of the Peace Circle by making DPF a part of your regular giving by making a recurring gift. Some give monthly. I choose to give quarterly while others make a significant gift annually. We have discovered that an annual membership of \$35 cannot sustain our work together. It will be through contributions given through a sustaining and steady commitment that we will grow our witness for peace and justice.

Brian Frederick-Gray, our Director for Mission Support & The Peace Intern Program, has been doing such thoughtful and grounded work with the Peace Interns as well as partnering with the Executive Committee to grow our presence and mission within and beyond the church.
