

# The Peace Intern Program

Thank you for your interest in the DPF Peace Intern program! This 12-week, paid summer internship (\$3,000 stipend) empowers young adults to serve as Ambassadors for Peace and Justice!

Since 1975, over 100 young adults have served as Peace Interns at over 1000 church camps and conferences. Additionally, for the last several summers Peace Interns have worked directly with Disciples Justice Ministries partners on "remote work week" projects as well.

Interns have gone on to become pastors, professors, community organizers, social workers, human rights activists, and other leaders in their communities. Through the Peace Intern program generations of Disciples youth have been exposed to new ideas/issues and challenged to faithfully respond as citizens of a global community.

# THE PEACE INTERN EXPERIENCE

The Peace Intern summer experience begins with Training Week in late May. Peace Interns are trained by peace and justice experts, denominational leaders, and other notable teachers to prepare them for their summer experience.

Peace Interns travel to host events all over the United States and Canada. They spend approximately one week immersed in intentional community (usually Disciples church camps). In recent summers Peace Interns have also had “remote work weeks” where they partner with Disciples Justice Ministries (such as AllianceQ, Green Chalice, and Reconciliation Ministries) as well as ecumenical/interfaith peace groups (such as the Inter-Religious Task Force on Central America and the Fellowship of Reconciliation) to work on specific projects that further the faithful work of these organizations.

Peace Interns serve as representatives of DPF and of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). It is preferred (but not required) that applicants have some experience in the denomination prior to applying.
